
How?

Qualities of a good study group:

1. It's OK to ask questions & take risks

We're here to learn together – no one is the expert

2. Everyone participates

All members share something (turn on mic or write in chat)

3. Welcoming and inclusive

Every member feels comfortable to talk and share perspectives

4. Well organized

 Study group leader is prepared with some discussion questions and perspectives to share



How do I lead my Study Group?



As Study Group Leaders...

- 1. Keep up with Arrive Ready academic and skill-building content
 - Review suggested Study Group questions each week!
- 2. Plan weekly study group
 - Create an agenda an ice-breaker or interactive game to start
 - Choose 2 3 questions based on Arrive Ready content to discuss (use questions provided or make up your own!)
- 3. Communicate with group members
 - Inform members of study group time
 - Send reminders and agenda prior to meeting
- 4. Support a welcome & inclusive learning environment

Don't worry: Study Group Leaders are not tutors; we're all learning together!



Leading a Study Group

Before

Create an agenda

Plan activities & discussion questions

Post Quercus announcement reminder for meeting

Start

Welcome participants

Introductions & Icebreaker

Explain your role & hope for group

Review agenda

Start discussion

During

Facilitate discussion & activities

Check the pace

Ask if members have a question for discussion

Summarize periodically

End

Thank everyone

Go around:
"What was your favourite part of this session" or "What is one thing you learned"

Ask if any remaining questions


